

NORTH EASTH BRAZIL UNION PATHFINDERS CHALLENGED



Every day, there were morning devotions, followed by many various activities which were all focused on the theme of the camporee. These activities were planned so well that at the end of the day the theme kept ringing in the minds of the pathfinders. The day ended with a power hour full of great singing, drama, testimonies from the local conferences and a sermon.

Pathfinders were divided into three major groups for day's activities. There were those who attended camp activities which included learning new honors and games. The other group went to do community service projects and the rest had an organized tour.

The South American Division Youth Director, Otimar Gonçalves, was asked why this camporee was both well organized and well attended, and he responded, "In the South American Division we have continued to cherish the Pathfinder Culture, every church has an organized pathfinder club with very well experienced leaders who oversee the success of these clubs at the local church level, and as they come to the camporee, they camp with their pathfinders and accompany them in all activities." He went on to say, "One area in which the Pathfinders in South America have focused on is the study of the Word of God." This was evidenced during the opening night when all the local Conference presidents and the president of North East Brazil Union marched on the po-

dium holding open Bibles in their hands. These leaders were sending a message to the thousands of pathfinders, that they still believe in the Bible. In each delegate package there was a Bible designed on the cover with the camporee logo "Born to win." During all the devotions each Pathfinder carried their Bible. Indeed the South American Division has kept its culture of Pathfinder, Salvation and Service and making the Bible the foundation of whatever they do with their young people!

At the end of the evening program, a baptism was held to conclude the power hour. These pathfinders demonstrated their love for the Word of God. They were there at worship by 6:30 am and on time, singing and carrying their Bibles.

There are 290,492 church members worshipping in 1,237 churches in the North East Brazil Union.

# From DEVILS CURVE to Hope Curve

Seventh-day Adventist Youth Make History in north Peru

he North Peru Union has successfully promoted the concept of Salvation and Service in every youth group. Either as a pathfinder or as a young adult, they have embraced this focus dubbed "Mision" Caleb.

The whole Union Youth Ministry stormed the city of Chiclayo and the Amazon for one full week from February 15th to 20th February, 2010. Over five thousand young people participated in "Mision" Caleb projects. Cleaning streets, singing, planting trees, painting buildings, health fairs etc. The youth made a huge impact in those areas in which they performed the activities.

In the Amazon, the Seventh-day Adventist Youth during this week changed the history of a road sign from the "Devils Curve" to the "Hope Curve". At this spot many people were killed during tribal fightings in recent months and many souls lost their lives until the



government named the spot where the fightings took place, "Devils Curve". After hearing this, young people approached the government officials and community leaders during this week of Mision Caleb to change the road sign from the Devils Curve to Hope Curve. First there was some resistance but finally the government gave in the demands of our youth who said they were the messengers of HOPE to the people of the Amazon.

Thousands of people gathered at the officiating of the name change: from Devils Curve to Hope Curve. The Regional Leader and town mayors were all there to witness this historic moment made by the Seventh-day Adventist youth. The local Indians praised the Seventh-day Adventist Youth for bringing HOPE to their people and they vowed loud and clear that never will there ever be another blood shedding. he whole month of MAY 2010 is dedicated for YOUTH BAPTISM in the northern hemisphere and the whole month of SEPTEMBER 2010 is dedicated for YOUTH BAPTISM in the southern hemisphere. Preparation for that special event should be done early.

It is recommended that you begin the preparation for the Youth Baptismal Celebration at least six months in advance. Candidates are given the Bible study. In six months all the 28 Fundamental Beliefs of the Seventh-day Adventist Church should be taught, either through personal Bible study or Public Evangelistic Meetings.

Make the Day of Baptism a Special Day for the Baptismal candidates, arrange a BIG CELEBRATION, decorate the church beautifully, prepare gifts, like Bibles, Song Book, etc. Arrange special pot-lucks to welcome them!

There is only one mode of baptism, by immersion. Matthew 3:16 reads: "As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him." Baptism is imperative. Jesus said that it is the only way for a person to see the Kingdom of God and to enter it (John 3:5).

The Pre-requisites for baptism consist in:

- 1. Being taught as Matthew 28:19 implies: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."
- 2. Believing: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16). L2U
